

7TH GRADE SUPPLY LIST 2011-2012

Please expect to replenish supplies as the year goes by, especially at semester time.

One of our goals in 7th grade is to assist students with their organizational skills. Therefore we are very specific with what we want and do *not* want students to use. With our combined teaching experience, we believe that we have developed a system for these kids that will help them have a more successful year.

Listed below are the items that all 7th grade students will need to have for their school year. Once the year starts, **specific classes may require other items beyond this list**, but this is the basic list for 7th grade and should service most courses well.

General items to be used in ALL classes:

- Preferred: 2" three-ring binder including 10 pocket folders; cloth-covered with a zipper
OR
- 12-pocket accordion folder; cloth-covered with a zipper
- We've also found that some students benefit from one binder for A days and one for B days.*
- LOTS of loose leaf paper
- Blue/black and red pens
- #2 Ticonderoga pencils for ALL CLASSES!
- Zippered pen/pencil holder
- Colored pencils/markers
- Highlighters
- 2 Elmer's glue sticks
- Scissors

(General Items cont'd)

- 4-function calculator
- 12" ruler (inch and cm markings)
- 3 pkg. lined 3x5 cards
- 512 MB minimum jump drive
- Kleenex (2-3 boxes)—turn in to your 1st hour A day teacher
- LOCKS: Students must purchase a lock with a rubber bumper from the school (\$5 at Get Connected Day) if they no longer have their lock from 6th grade. It is imperative that students lock their lockers!
- Hennepin County or Minneapolis Public Library Card to access online media resources
